In our continued commitment to keep you informed regarding UCC activity involving COVID-19, here are College updates (as of Friday, April 3).

There have been no significant operational changes at UCC since the last update that was sent on Wednesday, April 1. Daily calls with our state peers and the Higher Education Coordinating Commission (HECC) will continue Monday, April 6.

Monday, April 6, is also the official start of the Spring term. All students have been notified that most courses will be delivered online through the Spring term.

- New information for automotive students: All automotive classes will begin April 6 online. Be sure to connect with your instructor if this affects you.

A new web page called [Keep Learning](#) has been developed as a resource for students to provide important information as UCC moves services and instruction online.

For the students who still need to pick up books and supplies through the Hawk Shop, drive-thru pick-up service will be available again on Monday and Tuesday, April 6 & 7.
